Action Items from June 18, 2024 meeting

- Voted to sign renewals of two C&Y Service contracts
- Discussed and vote to renew contracts with P&J Mechanical for annual HVAC preventative maintenance agreement for prison, 911 center and courthouse
- Voted to accept bids on July 2 for excess equipment that commissioners approved for sale on Municibid at last meeting
- Voted to adopt a Wyoming County Integrity Policy
- Voted to accept and pay Carriage Barn Custom Builders \$5,727.64 for repairs to Courtroom 1
- Voted to appoint Matt Jones as our RTAC (NTRPDC Regional Transportation Advisory Committee) delegate replacing Lynelle Farber.
- Voted to appoint Rick Wilbur as our Economic Development Advisory Committee delegate replacing Lynelle Farber.
- Discussed and voted on allowing Tunkhannock Soccer Association to use field behind Ag Building. They will be responsible for all seeding, fill as necessary.
- Executive session to discuss legal matter.

Action Items to be Acted on Today

- Vote to promote Michael Munoz to Telecommunicator 2 from Telecommunicator 1. He has successfully completed all certifications
- Approve the hiring of Katty Moronta and Raelynn Jennings, as full-time correctional officers.

- Approve hiring of David Baltrusaitis, Cade Orlandini, and Alivia Hughes as part-time correctional officers
- Approve unpaid leave for CO Hector Camaja August 3 through August 7
- Approve unpaid leave for CO Vickie Green July 25, 26 and 29
- Accept the resignation of Morgan Theobald as juvenile probation officer
- Approve the purchase of computer to replace 7 year old computer in planner's office. Funds from records improvement fund.
- Approve the payment of \$30,000 from records improvement fund for partial payment for replacement of servers that is end of life with no service available at the end of July.
- Approve the remaining amount of \$92,933.81 for server replacement with half to be paid from ARP funds and half to be paid from Act 13 funds
- Approve spending \$75,910.87 from Opioid settlement funds to mail Detera Drug deactivation bags to all county households
- Vote to increase foster parent per diems by \$2 for most classes of children in the program. Special needs will increase by \$5 and \$10. Projected cost to county \$2,796. It is anticipated that the daily increase will result in additional in county resources rather than more expensive alternatives out of county, resulting in cost savings.
- Recognize 11 individuals who have entered the Voters Hall of Fame by having voted in 50 consecutive general elections. A ceremony honoring them will be scheduled for a later date depending on courtroom availability. They are: Florence Smalser, Willard Irion, John Bunnell, Linda and Sylvester Traver, Beverly and Timothy Poole, Nicholas Witiak, David Wilson, Margaret Hovan and Margaret Ellsworth
- Vote to appropriate \$1,250 to Crossroads Training to set up, maintain and promote a volunteer recruitment website to attract Emergency Services personnel for ambulance and fire personnel. As part of this program, they will have a stand at the Wyoming County Fair to promote the importance of becoming active in local emergency services. Funds will come out of Act 13 funds
- Vote to approve funding of \$5,550 from ARP funds for roof replacement at their facility in Nicholson
- Vote to approve the Municipal Automobile Theft/Motor Vehicle Insurance Fraud Intergovernmental agreement between the PA State Police and Wyoming County at a cost of \$190,364 annually to be 100% reimbursed to the county on a quarterly basis.
